In the absence of an ED, the co-coordinators of each department at the centre have come together and shared the running of the centre. Despite all of this extra activity, the staff has continued to operate a first class community health centre. They continue their every day practice of providing care to all of the clients and patients who walk through our doors. The medical side is continuing to work on streamlining the way in which all of the paper work gets done, using a computer system. The dental unit has bought and trained on new equipment, and is undergoing a restructuring of the unit. The Multi-Cultural Family Centre, downstairs, continues to serve an underserved population in innovative ways, as well as winning an award from the Canadian Red Cross.

It was once said that heroes do not act extraordinary in extraordinary times, but act ordinary in extraordinary times. This is what our staff has done. It comes as no surprise to me. A more dedicated, committed and passionate staff will not be found anywhere. Once again, I thank you, and commend you, and am very proud to be associated with all of you.

There are few communities in B.C. that are as fortunate as ours to have community-based primary health care delivered in a setting where teams work together to serve our varying needs. To paraphrase a former REACH physician, when REACH was begun over 35 years ago it was on the cutting edge of health care delivery. Today, it still is!

### Nutrition

In the centre, our nutritionist continues to provide nutrition education and counseling to individuals and families, as well as runs 2-3 groups/year each of Mindfulness Based Stress Reduction and the Mindful Eating Course.

In the community, she concluded her 3 year term as co-chair of the Vancouver Food Policy Council, leaving the council with many exciting projects and policy initiatives underway.

Through out the year she has presented at two professional conferences, did numerous presentations and workshops with local community organizations, and 3 media interviews.

She has been meeting regularly with the VCH nutritionists, and co-chaired the committee to develop a proposal for an Obesity Strategy for VCHA.

### Counselling

The Counselling services have been expanded to also focus on Family Counselling and Realtionship Counselling, and will continue with Individual Counselling and Changeways Groups. A post Changeways monthly Group has been ongoing. Counselling services continue to be well used.

### CELEBRATING COMMUNITY!

The Multicultural Family Centre celebrates community! After 17 years of working with the Vietnamese, Latin American, and African communities, the MFC appreciates the high level of knowledge, skill, and energy shown by community members in their commitment to improving the health of their communities. We value the relationships of trust and mutual respect which we have carefully nurtured; this is a sensitive and complex process which takes into account constantly changing internal and external sociopolitical dynamics. We endeavour to provide a safe and respectful environment to allow people to share their experiences and their knowledge with others.

This year we have engaged community in the design and delivery of a number of health promotion projects, including two Latin American Community Diabetes Screening Events, one Vietnamese Community Diabetes Screening Event, one Francophone African Diabetes Education Event, the first Vancouver Latin American Seniors' Health Fair, the Tohio! Summer Literacy Camp for African children, our first African Family Winter Celebration, and the AMSSA Multicultural Health Fair. La Cosecha, the Latin American Community Garden, is a work in progress (check it out at the corner of Broadway and Clark!) In addition, 3 members of the MFC Advisory Committees were elected to the REACH Board of Directors for 2007/08, and the MFC received a Community Service Award from the Canadian Red Cross.

### Dental

The dental department has seen many changes throughout the last year. We received two very generous grants from both the Woodward's Foundation and the Dental Society. With those funds we are giving ourselves a well deserved "face lift". We have purchased a new software program which hopefully will make us paperless by early next year. Our radiographs are now being taken digitally, something both the dentist's and the patient's love.

Along with all the clinical changes we also have had many staff changes-Martina, Paisley, and Brenda are all a wonderful additions to the front desk. Dr. Derhami who has worked at Reach since 2001, left us in August. Dr. Laura Stewart has changed her schedule to once a month when she does oral surgery for our patients. Dr. Adam Chipiuk has joined our team and is working with us full time. The department has also undergone a structural reorganization with two new positions being implemented-Maria Botero is our dental coordinator and Lorna Pennykid is the dental administrator.

All in all it has been an exceptionally busy year with a number of challenges, but as usual the dental staff has risen to overcome all of them with a positive and team approach. Well Done Everyone!!!!

### Pharmacy

REACH Pharmacy has had another successful year. We filled well over 6000 prescriptions in 2007, even with 5 weeks of closures. This is an average of over 500 prescriptions per month which is our highest totals ever. We introduced a new blister packing service to help our clients with compliance issues, and we went online with more third party insurance providers to simplify payment for many of our clients. Our pharmacist was published in a couple of journals for his work in transgender hormonal therapy, and he has continued to consult with the Downtown Eastside Women's Clinic to help establish their own pharmacy. The upcoming year appears to be just as promising and we hope to build on the success of 2007.

### Medical

Another year has flown by and the medical department remains busy as usual. All the medical staff has been working well together on our "paperless" journey.

Scanning all the medical documents into the patient chart has gone very well with a few minor hiccups along the way. Many more institutions are now sending test results directly through the computer which then are uploaded in to the patient electronic chart. This has made am impact on the front desk and filing positions so we are sill trying to increase job skills so the staff can do other jobs within the centre.

Our complement of staff has remained constant with a number of "REACH seasoned" locums covering for physicians on holiday throughout the year. In the coming year we look forward to implementing more paperless techniques and creating some extra space by culling the paper charts and sending them to storage.
